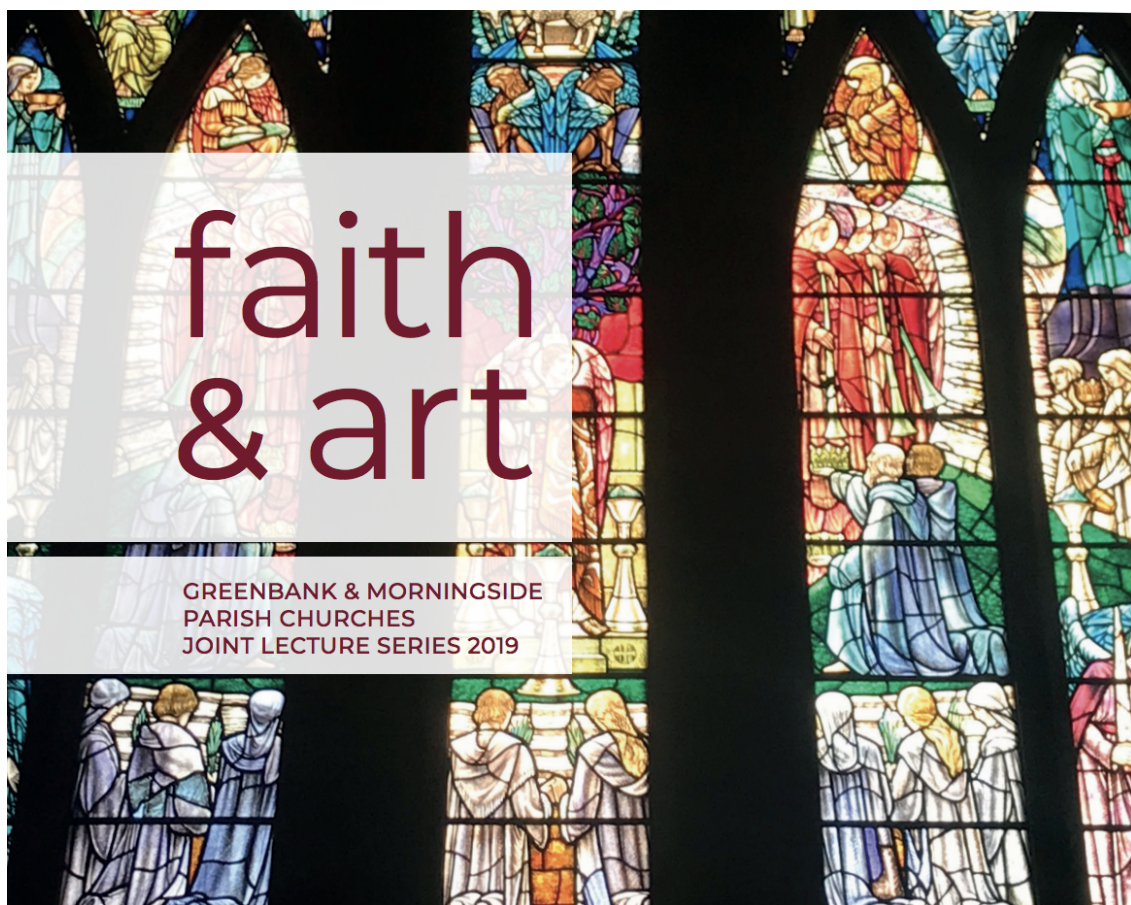

A lecture by **Michael Harvey**

When Jesus sent out the twelve disciples he told them to proclaim the Kingdom of God and heal the sick.
